Principal's Desk

Do everything without grumbling or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure," children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation." Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky as you hold firmly to the word of life.

The verse above, from which we get our school theme for the year: "Shine like stars," is found in Philippians 2:14-16. There is much to say about this passage, but I'll rein in my commentary to two brief points.

First of all (and perhaps obviously), it is very difficult to do everything without grumbling or arguing. Refraining from grumbling isn't always hard to do. When things are going our way, it's easy to fling this verse around at others, and it's tempting to feel pretty good about doing so. However, as I write this, I am in the middle of "one of those days." As a well-known children's book puts it: "Some days are like that, even in Australia." On the outside, I think I have done a pretty good job of keeping the grumbling to a minimum, but inside, I find myself feeling very cranky. That still counts! I still need to check the direction of my heart. When we introduced this verse to our students, I could practically hear the students rolling their eyes—of course the teachers are going to tell us not to grumble and argue. However, keeping clear of grumbling is also difficult for principals, teachers, pastors, farmers, business owners, grocery store clerks, and everyone else. James takes it a step farther when he writes, "Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds" (James 1:2). Instead of thinking (or saying), "Ugh. This is a bad day," let's remind ourselves that God gives wisdom to those who ask (and believe that He'll give it), God is the Giver of

Secondly, have you ever imagined what it would look like if only one star was shining in the night sky? I don't mean twilight, when the stars come out one at a time; I mean a pitch-black sky with a single star burning light years away. I think that Paul's hope for the Philippians is

that they will do this in community. On a clear night with all the stars shining and the moon joining in, you don't even need a flashlight to walk around. Grumbling and arguing can be contagious, but thankfulness—the antidote to grumbling—can spread just as quickly. So let's practice gratitude in community. Let's hold firmly to the word of life. Let's shine like stars.

Summer Camps/On Eagles Wings: This summer was full with camps and community outreach! We thank God for testimonies shared and hearts opened to the Gospel!


Passing the Baton: Our new Youth Director Barlow Gasper and youth group students honored Roger Scarboro for his discipleship over many years.

Pastor Bruce and Joyce Persenaire - Interim Pastor: My name is Bruce Persenaire. I am an STM (Interim) Pastor who has come to Zuni CRC to help them get ready for their next "settled" Pastor. My wife and I arrived in Zuni just a few weeks ago and I am already amazed by all the programs that this church of 175 worshippers is involved in to reach their community for the kingdom of God. I came in the middle of their Kids Club week in which about 60 kids were ministered to every morning for a week.



The next week we entertained the group, "On Eagles Wings" - a Native American ministry whose mission is to reach the community through basketball. Through this, over 60 young men and women signed cards wanting to know more about Christ and the church. Earlier in the summer they ran weeklong basketball, music and volleyball camps. The purpose of all this is to keep the church before the community and to minister to its needs. After 35+ years of ministry I was accustomed to summers being a time where many church programs took a break, with perhaps a week long VBS program. Not here in Zuni! While we continue to see seeds being planted, faith being nurtured, and a harvest brought in, the work is still a challenging task here in Zuni. We are excited about being here and getting to know the people that God has placed here in this church as well as the greater community.
