Dear Friends,

Our theme for this school year is "Oaks of Righteousness" based on Isaiah 61:1-3 (Jesus quoted part of this passage at a synagogue in Nazareth; you can read that story in Luke 4). We know that oak trees come from acorns. We also know that oak trees do not spring up overnight. According to some studies, it can take 5 to 6 years for a sprouting acorn to be self-sustaining. In the same way, as our mission statement reminds us, we are planting children in Biblical truth and surrounding them with God's grace. Sometimes seeds take a while to turn into trees, and yet every day we get to see how the seeds of faith are beginning to grow into something more beautiful. Here are just a few stories from the start of our school year:

- The mother of a kindergarten student was telling me that a family member is guite sick. Her kindergarten son has taken up praying for this relative. Recently, they were visiting her in the hospital when they walked past the meditation chapel there. The kindergartener stopped and said, "Mom, I know what to do here. We have a chapel at school. We should go in and pray."
- At one of our recent school chapels, a ZCMS staff member was preparing to share about someone in her life who was an example of an oak of righteousness. Because this person was close to her and had passed away, in the song before the time of sharing, the staff member began to cry softly. A sixth grade student noticed this, and without saying word, she walked over to the staff member and gave her a hug. It was a bold and beautiful thing for her to do. Later that day, that same sixth grade student wrote a note to the staff member which read in part, "Just know that your worth and purpose are secure when rooted in Christ."
- When a middle school student—new to our school this year—was asked, "What class are you enjoying most right now and why?" she answered, "I am enjoying Bible class the most because I finally get to learn about God."

ADVENT PRAYER VIGIL (\NOVEMBER 25, 2023

The season of Advent begins on Sunday, December 3, and through it, we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ our Savior as the Light that overcomes the darkness. This year In Zuni, November 25 is when Shalako takes place. In the Zuni religious tradition, this is the night the Zuni gods and ancestors come among the people to bring blessings and usher in the new year. It is accompanied by a period of fasting and darkness.

We invite you to kick off this Advent season by joining us in a 12-hour Prayer Vigil on Saturday, November 25 from 6:00pm – 6:00am. The evening will begin with a time of worship. The purpose of this event is to be unified in prayer for the Zuni community - humbling ourselves and seeking God together for the healing light of His presence in every dark, broken place.

How can you participate? We encourage you to not only join us in praying from home, but also to write down a prayer for Zuni prior to the event and mail it to us to post around the church sanctuary where people will gather to worship and pray throughout the night. 
SPECIAL NEEDS

MINISTRY UPDATE

On Eagle's Wings: This summer we welcomed a team of Native youth from On Eagles' Wings for a three-day outreach event in Zuni. With the support of Hutchcraft Ministries, OEW strives to bring hope to their fellow youth on Native lands. This year their tour focused on the southwest. Their high-energy evening events brought basketball, games, and stories together. They told the good news of the Gospel through the stories of their own lives - real, relatable, and pointed toward the hope of Jesus Christ.



Inspired by their outreach efforts, we held a follow-up event in August. The basketball tournament was a big hit. Barlow Gasper, our youth leader, drew the story of the good news in one man's life. We hope to have another outreach event this fall. Barlow has also refocused the

youth group on intentional outreach on Wednesdays, and more focused discipleship on Sunday evenings. We're grateful to be able to partner with ministries like OEW that show that new hope in Christ is for all tribes and nations, including the people of Zuni.
